FIRE STATION REPORT

Station 96 had a pretty quiet winter, with 22 calls from October 1, 2014, through February 28, 2015. Half of the calls were EMS calls, and one was a medical assist. Five calls were either cancelled or no incident was found on arrival. Three fire calls included two burns that turned out to be authorized and controlled, and a third that was for a trash fire. There was also one call for a non-injury accident and one call for a power line down.

Thanks to our local fire and EMS crews for always being there, and let's hope it stays quiet at Station 96.

Neighbors have helped get us unstuck in the winter, watched our children, brought us fresh garden produce, and shared stories over glasses of wine. We have made sure everything was ok when our neighbor's burglar alarm went off, plowed a neighbor's garden, and lent helping hands on various projects. We look out for each other, we help each other, and we enjoy each others' company.

This neighborliness, this sense of community, is one of the things that makes the Foothills a great place to live. We love the quiet, the wildlife, the beautiful views, the farmland - brilliant green in the spring, bright yellow and dark green in the summer, fading to golden brown in the fall. But the community makes this place truly special.

Why does this place have such a strong sense of community? Part of it surely is simply a product of living in a rural area. Rural life offers challenges that are often best faced with help. We look after each other when it's needed, but we also respect each other's privacy and desire for peace and quiet. But it is more than just the rural spirit and the people who live here. It is also in the work and efforts of the Foothills Church and the Foothills Rural Association.

COMMUNITY CENTER RENTALS



The Foothills Rural Association, 11000 N. Forker Road, was established as a non-profit corporation under section 502(C) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code on December 12, 1983. The purposes of the corporation are to organize the property owners and/or current residents within the boundaries of Fire District 9, Station 6: to provide a forum by which the property owners and/or current residents to assist governmental agencies in better planning the use and resources of the Foothills area: to preserve and protect the rural agricultural environment.

Voting Membership in the Association is open to any property owner or current resident within the Foothills boundaries. Membership dues are \$20 per year. Non-voting Membership is available to others through payment of dues. The Association is governed by elected volunteer officers and a board of directors. FRA Alerts system has been established in an effort to increase community awareness about crime occurring in our area. Residents are encouraged to report ALL crimes to Crime Check, 456-2233. The Foothills Community Center, 11000 N. Forker Road, which is located adjacent to the Foothills Fire Station, exists as a result of community efforts to save and renovate the former Foothills School Building. 


