

MYSTERY CROP... SOMETHING ODD IS GROWING by Marc McIntosh

Many people have stopped by Kevin Kaelin's place, across Forker Road from the Foothills church, to ask about the crop being grown on the corner with the flags in the ground. No, it isn't marijuana as a few residents thought it might be. And Kevin hasn't let the field go to weeds. The Kaelins are growing the South American "superfood" quinoa (pronounced "KEEN-wah").

The Kaelins were contacted by the McKay Seed Company of Moses Lake about growing a test plot of quinoa. McKay Seed wanted to see if quinoa could be grown in the cooler temperatures of Spokane, as Moses Lake was too warm. Of all the years to have record high temperatures while doing a test planting. There is a second test plot in Rockford area.



Quinoa is most closely associated with the South American countries of Peru, Ecuador, Bolivia, and Columbia. It is a pseudocereal rather than a true cereal. Quinoa is more closely related to species such as beet roots, spinach, and tumble weeds - which might explain its weedy look.

The recent trend of things being 100% gluten-free has made quinoa much more interesting as a crop. Quinoa can be used by those trying to be gluten-free since it isn't a cereal grain. Quinoa is also high in protein, making it popular with both vegetarians and those eating a high-protein, low-carb diet.

There are over 200 varieties of quinoa and several varieties were planted to see which variety would do best. The crop will be hand harvested later this fall and evaluated shortly thereafter. Who knows we might be growing quinoa in the future in the Foothills.

FOOTHILLS EVENTS BRING NEIGHBORS TOGETHER

The FRA Board got a workout scooping ice cream in July as they served over 200 people frosty desserts. Twelve gallons of ice cream were scooped, more than 22 liters of root beer, orange, and cream soda were poured, and dozens of cones were handed out. The guests also enjoyed burgers and brats served by the Foothills Church, and admired the neighborhood's classic cars. At the end of the day, about a gallon of ice cream remained, which was donated along with a few dozen cones to the hard-working firefighters at Station 96.









FIRE STATION REPORT

From mid-May to the beginning of October, Fire Station 96 kept busy with 27 calls. The engines rolled on six fires - one cooking fire, and five brush, grass, and forest fires. Two calls were for unauthorized burning - remember to get your permits! The crews were dispatched to four vehicle accidents and nine emergency medical service and assist calls. Five times the call was cancelled or no incident was found at the address. There was also one call for a flammable liquid spill and one call for "odor of smoke." August was the busiest month with nine incidents.

The firefighters also welcomed the neighborhood to their open house in July - hopefully many of you stopped by to say "Thank You!"

The Foothills Rural Association, 11000 N. Forker Road, was established as a non-profit corporation under section 502(C) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code on December 12, 1983. The purposes of the corporation are to organize the property owners and/or current residents within the boundaries of Fire District 9, Station 6: to provide a forum by which the property owners and/or current residents to assist governmental agencies in better planning the use and resources of the Foothills area: to preserve and protect the rural agricultural environment.

Voting Membership in the Association is open to any property owner or current resident within the Foothills boundaries. Membership dues are \$20 per year. Non-voting Membership is available to others through payment of dues. The Association is governed by elected volunteer officers and a board of directors. FRA Alerts system has been established in an effort to increase community awareness about crime occurring in our area. Residents are encouraged to report ALL crimes to Crime Check, 456-2233. The Foothills Community Center, 11000 N. Forker Road, which is located adjacent to the Foothills Fire Station, exists as a result of community efforts to save and renovate the former Foothills School Building. 
