MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS NEEDED

Yearly the FRA sponsors free events: an Egg Hunt, a Fun Run, hands out free root beer floats in conjunction with Foothills Community Church BBQ, serves the yearly Chili Feed, hosts an annual family Christmas party and hands out yearly scholarships. These events, along with the publishing of this newsletter and maintenance of the community center and grounds rely on the finances provided by the yearly membership dues. HEGLAR KRONQUIST SITE

UPDATE 2013

The WA State Department of Ecology is working with Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Corporation (now DCO Management) to complete environmental cleanup work at the Heglar Kronquist site.

The Heglar Kronquist Site is a former gravel pit near the intersection of Heglar and Kronquist Roads that was filled during the 1970's with black dross, a by-product of aluminum processing at the Kaiser Aluminum plant.

Workers began site preparation in September, and the work is expected to be completed in the summer of 2014. The existing landfill cover or cap along with drainages will be improved and additional layers added to the cap. The vent system will be repaired if it can be done without damage to the existing cap. Stormwater and site drainage will be improved. The existing landfill cap will be filled with a) soil from the soil pile on the eastern end of the landfill; b) clean fill from offsite; and c) regraded. A geosynthetic liner will be placed over the landfill and then a drainage layer placed on top of the liner. The multi-layer liner will be covered with 18" of top soil and natural grasses planted on top. To further help prevent storm water infiltration, the geosynthetic liner will extend 5-10 feet beyond the current dross fill boundary on the north, east and south edges of the landfill. On the west edge the liner and drain system will extend 50-75 feet beyond the dross fill boundary. Additionally, ten pine trees will also be removed along the southern boundary of the landfill to prevent future root system damage to the landfill. For more information, contact William Fees, P.E. 

The Foothills Rural Association, 11000 N. Forker Road, was established as a non-profit corporation under section 502(C) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code on December 12, 1983. The purposes of the corporation are to organize the property owners and/or current residents within the boundaries of Fire District 9, Station 6: to provide a forum by which the property owners and/or current residents to assist governmental agencies in better planning the use and resources of the Foothills area: to preserve and protect the rural agricultural environment.

Voting Membership in the Association is open to any property owner or current resident within the Foothills boundaries. Membership dues are \$20 per year. Non-voting Membership is available to others through payment of dues. The Association is governed by elected volunteer officers and a board of directors.

FRA Alerts system has been established in an effort to increase community awareness about crime occurring in our area. Residents are encouraged to report ALL crimes to Crime Check, 456-2233. 
