#### BIRDS OF THE FOOTHILLS

#### **Wintering Birds**

There are a number of birds that visit the Foothills in the winter months, such as the Pine Grosbeak, Bald Eagle, Stellar Jay, Merlin and the Bohemian Waxwings. This article features two of the most commonly seen visitors: the Northern Shrike and the Rough-Legged Hawk. Northern Shrike. This little bird is only ten inches long, but holds its own among many larger birds. It is gray, white and black, with a heavy black eye line. It has a hooked bill for tearing food apart. Its food consists of rodents, lizards, and large insects as well as small birds. The



Northern Shrike hunts in open fields. These little birds migrate 500 to 1,000 miles; all the way from Alaska, the Yukon, Northwest Territories, Northern Canada and parts of the Arctic to the Foothills area. They arrive here in mid-October and head back north

in mid-April. The Shrike is a songbird with many beautiful rambling songs. It sings in the fall when it first arrives and sings in the spring as if calling for a mate before starting its trip back north. You will see this bird on power lines along the roads or hovering in one spot over fields while watching the movement of its prey in the grass before diving to grab it with its bill. The Shrike has a typical songbird feet which are only strong enough for perching, therefore, it must find some other way to hold the food while tearing small pieces off for a meal. The Shrike finds a thorn in a Hawthorn tree or a barb on a fence which it uses to impale mice. It may also wedge the food into a tight fork of two branches.

Don't confuse the Shrike with the American Kestrel which is a little larger and very colorful. The kestrel is a falcon that hunts in the same manner as the Shrike. Rough-Legged Hawk. The name comes from the

feathers on the leg which runs down to the talons. This large hawk and the Shrike compete for the same space and rodents both here and up north. Rough-legs generally arrive about a week or two after the shrikes. Rough-leg hawks migrate in large loose flocks. These hawks are the same size as our local Red-tail hawks. The Rough-leg hawk is white, black and brown with a white upper tail that has a heavy black band near the end. Their neck is white; the breast is black. A rectangular black wrist stands out on the underside of white wings as they fly; their white head is broken by a black eye line and whisker mark. They hunt just like the shrikes – from poles, overhead wires, and tree tops. They also hover in one spot just like the Shrikes. Use your bird books and binoculars to study these and other wintering birds.

The Foothills Rural Association, 11000 N. Forker Road, was established as a non-profit corporation under section 502(C) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code on December 12, 1983. The purposes of the corporation are to organize the property owners and/or current residents within the boundaries of Fire District 9, Station 6: to provide a forum by which the property owners and/or current residents to assist governmental agencies in better planning the use and resources of the Foothills area: to preserve and protect the rural agricultural environment.

Voting Membership in the Association is open to any property owner or current resident within the Foothills boundaries. Membership dues are \$20 per year. Non-voting Membership is available to others through payment of dues. The Association is governed by elected volunteer officers and a board of directors.

A Community Crime Log has been established in an effort to increase community awareness about crime occurring in our area. The crime log will be published in the newsletter. 
