DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY NEWS RELEASE

April 30, 2010

Kaiser Aluminum & Chemical Corporation, LLC (Kaiser) will begin work May 3, 2010, to take water samples at an old aluminum byproduct disposal area at the intersection of Heglar and Kronquist roads in Mead, 10 miles northeast of downtown Spokane. This work is part of a legal order between Kaiser and the Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology). The order requires Kaiser to conduct what's called a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study at the "Heglar Kronguist" site. The purpose of the investigation is to gather more scientific information about what the contaminants are, where they are located, and how much is there. The Feasibility Study will evaluate options for how to clean it up. From 1969 until 1974, Kaiser disposed of nearly 55,000 cubic yards of black dross from the Trentwood plant in the Spokane Valley to the disposal site operated by Gemini Management, Inc. Kaiser later bought the property in 1991. Black dross is a by-product from processing aluminum that contains sodium, potassium, aluminum, chloride, fluoride, ammonia, nitrates, nitrites and metals. These chemicals may be harmful to human health and the environment if they exceed certain levels. The dross disposal stopped in 1974 because high levels of chloride were found in shallow water supply wells and springs down gradient of the site. Air sampling conducted downwind of the site in 1979 showed elevated levels of several organic compounds. Ammonia also was detected at levels higher than accepted by state laws. During May, Kaiser will sample surface water, groundwater, and well water along roadways and on certain private properties near the Heglar Kronquist site. Property owners affected by the work have already been contacted and have agreed to allow access to their properties. Kaiser took several steps to address the contamination in 1984 including installing a cover designed to isolate and protect the dross pile. Monitoring during the early 1980s through 2004 indicated decreasing but still elevated chloride and nitrates in springs down gradient of the site. Results of domestic well testing conducted in 2008 showed only one property with slightly elevated levels of potential site-related contaminants, but more information is needed in order to have a more comprehensive understanding of the area. Kaiser will continue its investigation and prepare a report of the findings along with an evaluation of possible cleanup options. Ecology will review the report and cleanup options. Once Ecology approves the draft remedial investigation documents they will be made available for public comment in late summer or early fall 2011. ILLEGAL DUMPING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY

Code Enforcement

Illegal dumping on your private property, in your garbage can or dumpster, or at your place of business can be reported to Code Enforcement. To do this you must have identification from the persons who left the items. Identification would include a license plate number, a witness who recognized the persons leaving the items or something found which identifies the persons such as an old bill, or a magazine subscription. In the latter case this ID must have a name AND address. The City does not go through illegal dumps to find these items. If you wish to report it you must find the identification. Any illegal dumping without identification become the responsibility of the property owner. Once reported, the Code Enforcement officers attempt to contact the persons who left the illegal dump in order to rectify the situation.

Fines for illegal dumping are as follows: In the City: \$513.00. In the County: \$1000.00 and/or 90 days in jail. Through the City Code enforcement office there are crews available to clean up garbage/debris/furniture/etc dumped on a right of way or street, also there are crews that will pick up litter along county roads. 

FOOTHILLS COMMUNITY CHURCH SUMMER CAMPS



NEIGHBORHOOD ALERT SYSTEM



In the past couple months the FRA board has been made aware of attempted and successful home burglaries. After discussion of these events, board members felt the need for an "alert" system in the Foothills area.


David Fisher, our FRA Webmaster, was asked to investigate possible quick notification avenues for both computer and cell phone users. Events such as burglaries, fugitives-on-the-loose, wildfires, drug houses and road closures are examples of events/situations that community members should be made aware of in a timely manner.

Following his thoughtful research, David discovered we can share almost 'live' information using the social-network site Twitter as a messaging service for regular email or one-way texting on cell phones. Not much traffic is anticipated on this system - we expect in the order of a dozen alerts per year. Simple Twitter alert tests have been run with success.

The Foothills Rural Association, 11000 N. Forker Road, was established as a non-profit corporation under section 502(C) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code on December 12, 1983. The purposes of the corporation are to organize the property owners and/or current residents within the boundaries of Fire District 9, Station 6: to provide a forum by which the property owners and/or current residents to assist governmental agencies in better planning the use and resources of the Foothills area: to preserve and protect the rural agricultural environment.

Voting Membership in the Association is open to any property owner or current resident within the Foothills boundaries. Membership dues are \$20 per year. Non-voting Membership is available to others through payment of dues. The Association is governed by elected volunteer officers and a board of directors.

A Community Crime Log has been established in an effort to increase community awareness about crime occurring in our area. The crime log will be published in the newsletter. 
