Or should I expect to get other, better scholarships somewhere else? If you answered NO to any of these questions, please apply for the Jess Kronquist Memorial Scholarship. The Foothills Rural Association and the Blue Ribbon Circle fund up to a total of \$3,000 in funds for college education. In the past several years we have assisted many Foothills residents, all ages, all disciplines, all needs, in achieving their educational goals. The requirements are identified in the scholarship application found on page 3 of this newsletter. You must be a resident of the Foothills area as determined by the Scholarship Committee. Applicants may request paper versions from FRA Board members or by email request to Mike Britton, mbritton@icehouse.net. Applications may also be downloaded from the FRA website, www.ruralspokane.com. The Scholarship Committee will select recipients and determine awards based upon the number of applicants and their applications.

Jesse Grover Kronquist by Cindy Kaelin

Many of the people who live in the Foothills Community wonder who is Jesse Kronquist? This long time resident of the Foothills and his generosity is the primary reason that our community has been able to award many scholarships throughout the years. The Kronquist family played an important roll in the Foothills history. Jesse's dad Alfred settled here in June of 1881, while his mother, Hildur, came to live with her aunt, Mrs. John Johnson a Foothills resident, in 1889. Some time later, Alfred and Hildur were married and Jesse was born in 1895. Jesse grew up, became active in his father's farming and sawmilling business. The mill was started about 1895 and operated for approximately 28 years. Jesse graduated from one of the Spokane high schools and spent a year or so at a local business college. During World War I, Jesse spent about a year with the American Expeditionary Force in France. Once back home in the Foothills, he became active in the organization and betterment of the local grange and spent many years as a director of the Foothills Township, focusing on the development and care of the roads and other community needs. Jesse never married and after his father passed away, decided to care for his mother. Jesse's mother passed away in 1975, nearly 101 years old.

Jesse asked Lloyd Lancaster, who was raised on Pleasant Prairie, and later moved to a small farm in Williams Valley, if he would consider moving back to the Foothills and renting Jesse's farm ground. Lloyd agreed to the terms and his family moved back to the Foothills area. The Lancaster family lived in the small house on Darknell road, which belonged to Jesse. For the next 45 years, Lloyd rented his farm and looked after Jesse. In the fall of 1989, while living alone in a small house in Millwood, Jesse fell and broke his hip, and feared he had cancer. Jesse never was able to return to his home and lived the rest of his life at Unicrest Healthcare Center. Jesse died Nov, 1 1989, at the age of 94. In his will he designated that his estate to be divided three ways: to the Blue Ribbon Circle, Foothills Rural Association and to the Pleasant Prairie Cemetery Association.

Youth Committee


Earn Community Service Credit as you work with your local community and wonderful neighbors!

January 16, 2008

Elections were then held with all board members re-elected to their current position. There were two Committee Member positions expiring, those of Cheryl Britton and Angela Priest. Mitch Roland and Eric Barr were elected to fill those three year positions. Following the election, Community Center rental fees were discussed. The proposal was made following a lively discussion to keep the current rental fees of \$30 for active FRA members, \$100 for non-FRA members, with current board officers and board members to receive one free rental per year while serving in an elected position. The proposal passed with a small margin in the secret ballot voting.

The Foothills Rural Association was established as a non-profit corporation under section 502(C) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code on December 12, 1983. The purposes of the corporation are to organize the property owners and/or current residents within the boundaries of Fire District 9, Station 6: to provide a forum by which the property owners and/or current residents to assist governmental agencies in better planning the use and resources of the Foothills area: to preserve and protect the rural agricultural environment.

Voting Membership in the Association is open to any property owner or current resident within the Foothills boundaries. Membership dues are \$20 per year. Non-voting Membership is available to others through payment of dues. The Association is governed by elected volunteer officers and a board of directors.

A Community Crime Log has been established in an effort to increase community awareness about crime occurring in our area. The crime log will be published in the newsletter. Residents are encouraged to report all crimes to the police. After making a police report, please call: 928-6610.

The Foothills Community Center, located on Forker Road, adjacent to the Foothills Fire Station, exists as a result of community efforts to save and renovate the former Foothills School Building. The Center, used for many community activities, is maintained and supported by the Foothills Rural Association. It is available for use by members of the Foothills Rural Association for a nominal utilities charge and by non-members for a reasonable rental fee. 
